

Maya Cohen Levy

Maya Cohen Levy was born in Tel Aviv in 1955. She studied art at the Kalisher School of Art, and philosophy at the Tel Aviv University. Over the years she has taught at Kalisher, The Bezalel Academy for Art and Design in Jerusalem and at the Tel Aviv University. She currently teaches master classes, and lives and works in Tel Aviv. In her present work, Cohen Levy, who is represented by Gordon Gallery, utilizes several mediums concurrently, comprising painting, photography and sculpture. Her solo exhibitions include The Israel Museum (1994), The Tel Aviv Museum of Art (2000) and The Herzliya Museum of Contemporary Art (2005), as well as a multitude of solo exhibitions in galleries in Tel Aviv, London, New York, Munich and Berlin. Her works are featured in many noteworthy collections, including The Israel Museum, Tel Aviv Museum of Art, Haifa Museum of Art and The Jewish Museum in New York, as well as various other public and private collections in Israel and worldwide. She has received numerous prizes and awards, including The Michel Kikoine Prize (Faculty of the Arts at Tel Aviv University), The Janet and George Japin Prize (America-Israel Cultural Foundation), The Israeli Culture and Education Ministry Award, The Dan Sandel Sculpture Award (Tel Aviv Museum) and the IDB Award (The Israel Museum). In 1993 she received the America-Israel (Sharet) Cultural Foundation Foreign Study Grant (China).
